

Who We Are

Founded in 2003, Liberty For Youth is a non-profit, charitable organization that focuses on prevention and intervention for at-risk youth. We give support to youth who are in poverty; those who are on probation; youth who are involved with gangs, guns, and drugs, as well as those who are trapped in negative environments.

Our regular clientele is at-risk youth aged 12-25 and alumni members beyond the age of 25, who are currently involved or likely to be involved in criminal activity and live in the Ontario Golden Horseshoe area. These youths are characterized by low education, poor health, and unsafe environments.



We affirm positive patterns of behaviour while creating opportunities for youth to assist in community development programs. We also help create productive interaction with parents, teachers, and community leaders.

2022-2023 marks another successful and exciting year for Liberty For Youth. We have grown in almost every aspect as an organization and as I look back, I am proud of the accomplishments of our youth and filled with gratitude for the support that made this possible.

In the past year, we expanded our Bright Choices, Prodigal Sonz, and Character Development programs beyond the services provided prepandemic and launched two new programs, 'LEAD' and 'LeadingWell' at our 7Rs location.

Based on the recommendations of our Youth Council in 2021, our three-year Covid Recovery Strategy was launched in 2022. The council had identified three areas where youth are facing inequalities because of the pandemic: Education, Employment, and Mental Health. To raise funds to support our programming as we expanded to serve these three areas, the three-year Recovery Run For Youth was launched in April 2022.

We are also excited to announce that we completed the construction of an outdoor basketball court at our 7Rs Ranch location in Brantford in April. This has been possible due to a generous donation from the Trillium Foundation and the support of Effort Trust. The new court helped us run new and exciting programming for youth through 2022 summer.

I would like to say a huge THANK YOU to all our sponsors, supporters, and partners who enabled us to serve our youth as they transitioned out of the pandemic. We are excited to share with you all the youth successes that were possible through your support!




Revenue 2022 \$1,188,597
